In exchange for the comfort of toilets, kitchens, bathrooms, etc., a large amount of domestic wastewater is produced.

This wastewater is purified in sewers and septic tanks and then discharged into rivers.

Let's follow proper drainage etiquette and protect the rich land and water.

Bad manners	What's Not Good	trouble
	Paper and fabrics other than toilet paper that do not dissolve in water	Tissue paper, wet tissues, disposable diapers, towels, underwear, sanitary products, hair, etc.
	Vegetable scraps and leftovers	Meat, fish, vegetable scraps, leftover food, packaging wrap, etc.
	Oil, volatile and highly toxic substances, boiling water	Cooking oil, alcohol, gasoline, oil, highly toxic substances, boiling water, etc.

		It hardens and water won't flow Drain pipes are damaged Fires and explosions occur

*Foreign objects may get mixed in wastewater and cause problems. Please do not pour garbage into the drainage system, but separate it and dispose of it properly.

Clogged drains, bad odors, and repairs to facilities cost a lot of money.

It is important to follow proper drainage etiquette and regularly check drains and inlets.
